Completion of equivalent transfer courses prior to the term of entry to University of Illinois coursework which satisfy General Education requirements on this campus is **highly recommended**.

Language Requirement: All transfer applicants must have completed either three years of one language other than English in high school or through the second level (2 semesters) of one language other than English in college prior to the desired term of entry. It is **strongly recommended** that transfer applicants complete the Language Requirement for this college prior to transfer. This college's graduation requirement is satisfied by completion through the **third year** of one language other than English in high school or through the **third level** (3 semesters) of one language other than English in college. *Students applying to Speech and Hearing Science are **strongly encouraged** to study Spanish because of the high demand for Spanish as a second language.*
